THE GREG NORMAN COURSE

We would like to take this opportunity to welcome you to the Greg Norman Signature golf course at Eagle Ridge Golf and Country Club. One of our four great championship courses at Eagle Ridge, the Norman course features undulating greens, generous fairways, rugged ravines and deeply sculptured bunkers. We hope you will utilize this specially designed yardage book to help you find your way successfully from tee to green and into the hole.

- Distance from point to center of green
 Distance from blue tee to point

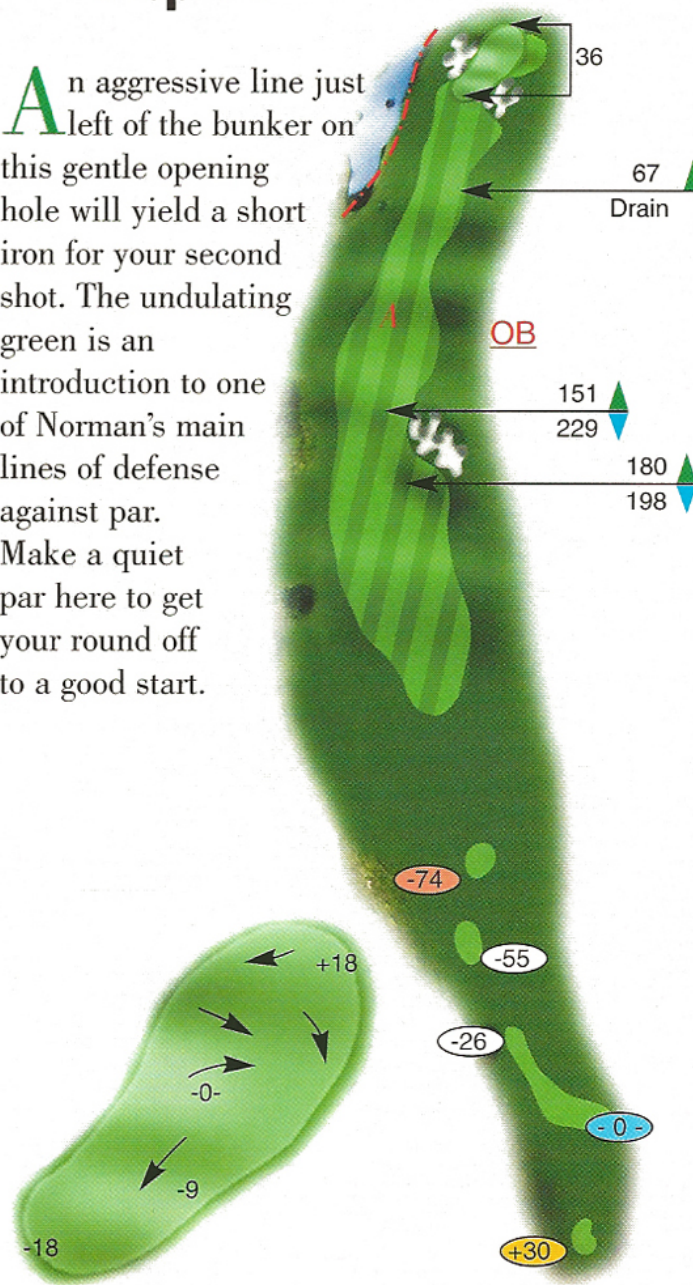
- All measurements are from the blue tee markers. Add or subtract the appropriate amount to determine the correct distance to hazards from your tees. Par-3s show distance to front and rear of green along the play line.

- Lateral Hazards

- All measurements are laser accurate to 1 yard. Measurements to the greens are to the center. Add or subtract appropriately for front and rear pin positions. Measurements are to the center of the green unless otherwise noted.

1 Par 4 **410** **380** 325 **306**
Hcp 11

An aggressive line just left of the bunker on this gentle opening hole will yield a short iron for your second shot. The undulating green is an introduction to one of Norman's main lines of defense against par. Make a quiet par here to get your round off to a good start.

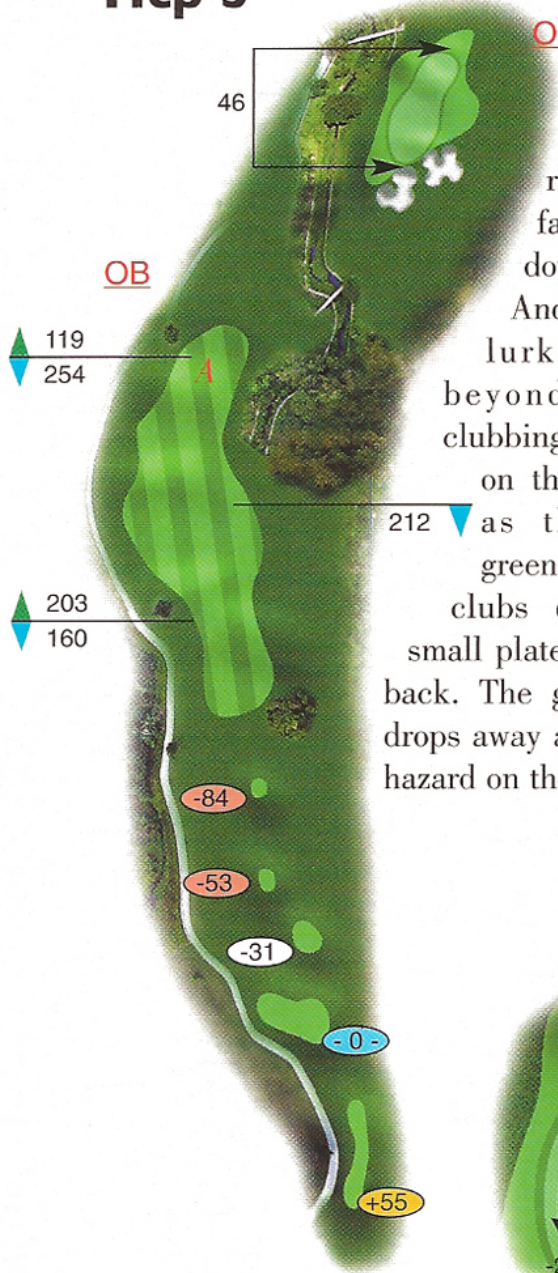

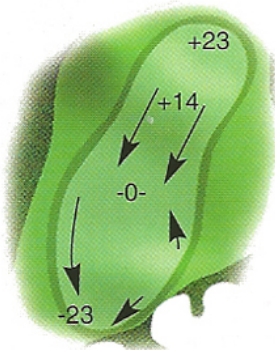

Strong Shitters can run out of fairway on this downhill dogleg. And there is O.B. lurking not far beyond. Accurate clubbing is important on the second shot as the elevated green is nearly five clubs deep, with a small plateau at the very back. The green platform drops away and toward the hazard on the left side.



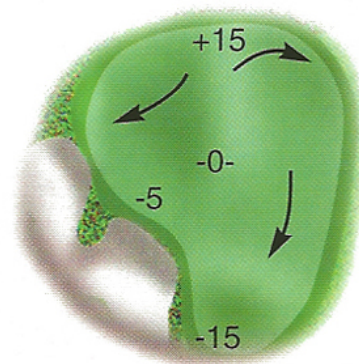

Hcp 3

Early in the round, treat this lovely hole as a legitimate 5 shots and if you make 4, count your blessings. Conservative play will be rewarded. Though the green is small and heavily contoured, it will accept well struck short irons. The key to a good score is in the approach: make sure you arrive on the proper side of the small green that is divided by a fatal ridge top to bottom.



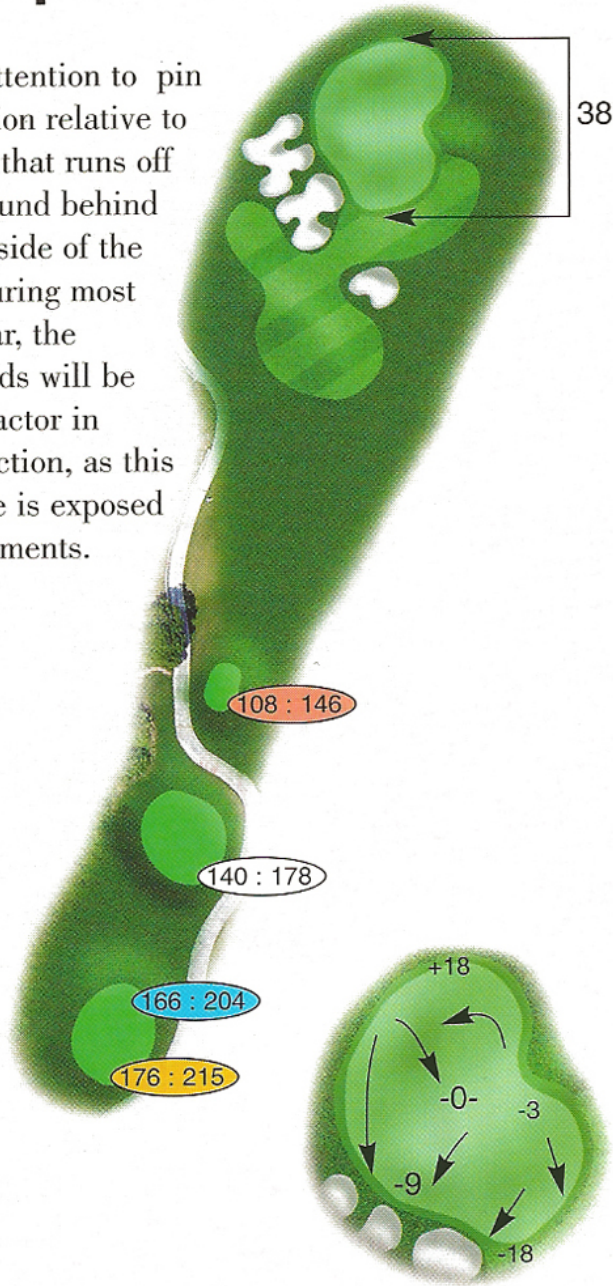

Pay attention to pin position relative to the ridge that runs off of the mound behind the right side of the green. During most of the year, the trade winds will be a major factor in club selection, as this short hole is exposed to the elements.



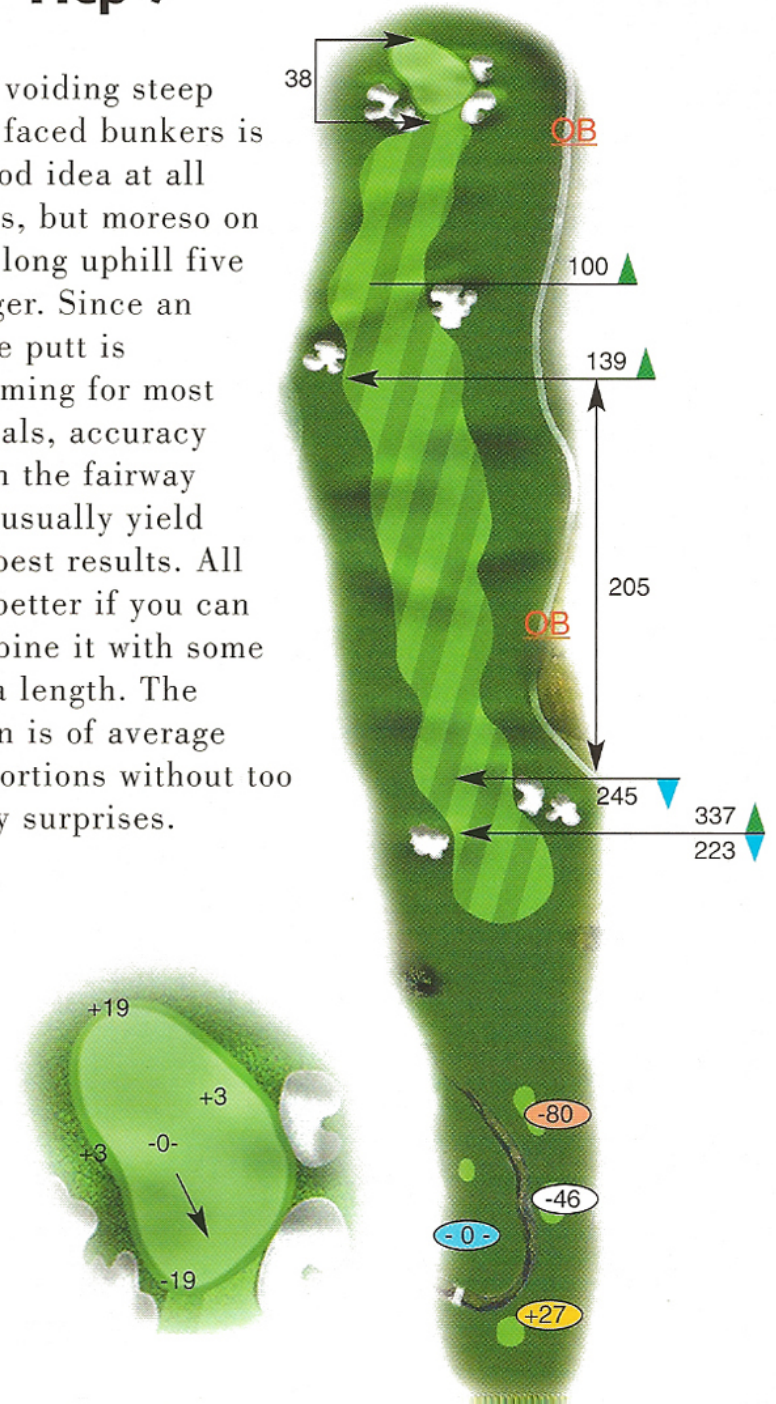

Avoiding steep faced bunkers is a good idea at all times, but moreso on this long uphill five banger. Since an eagle putt is dreaming for most mortals, accuracy down the fairway will usually yield the best results. All the better if you can combine it with some extra length. The green is of average proportions without too many surprises.

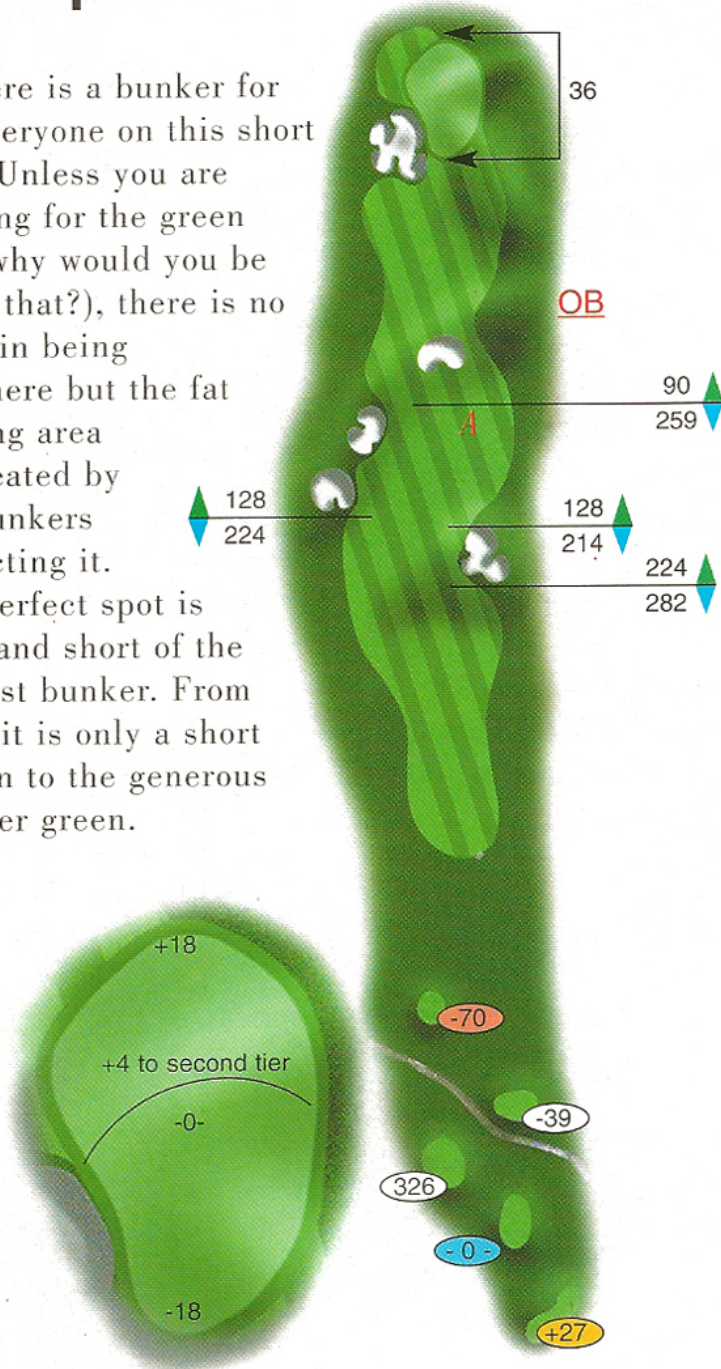

6 Par 4 **377** **349** **313** **279**
Hcp 17

There is a bunker for everyone on this short hole. Unless you are gunning for the green (and why would you be doing that?), there is no point in being anywhere but the fat landing area delineated by the bunkers protecting it. The perfect spot is right and short of the farthest bunker. From there it is only a short iron in to the generous two tier green.

If ever this hole takes a name it will be "Temptation." The generous green is within reach under most conditions and the sandy consequences for a miscue are easily imagined. The alternative to brute strength is a well placed iron or fairway wood to the middle of the fairway and a deft wedge to the green.



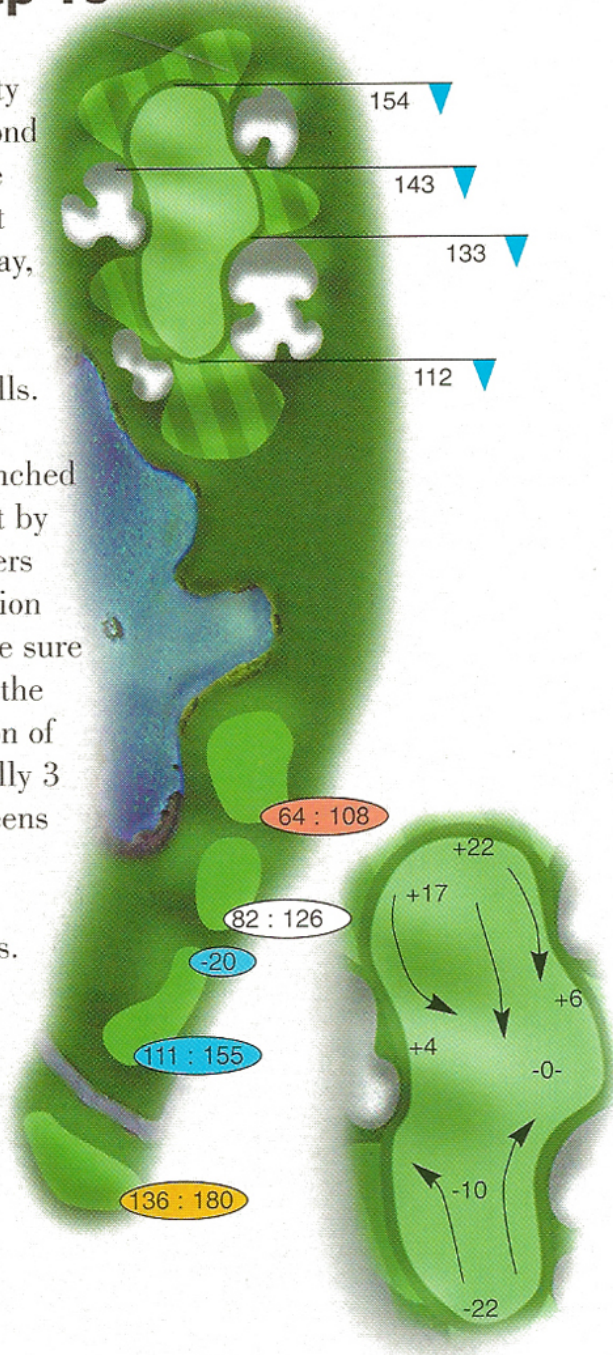

The pretty little pond fronting the green is not really in play, though it collects its share of balls. The narrow green is pinched in the waist by deep bunkers and collection areas. Make sure you are on the right section of what is really 3 smaller greens divided by slopes and undulations.

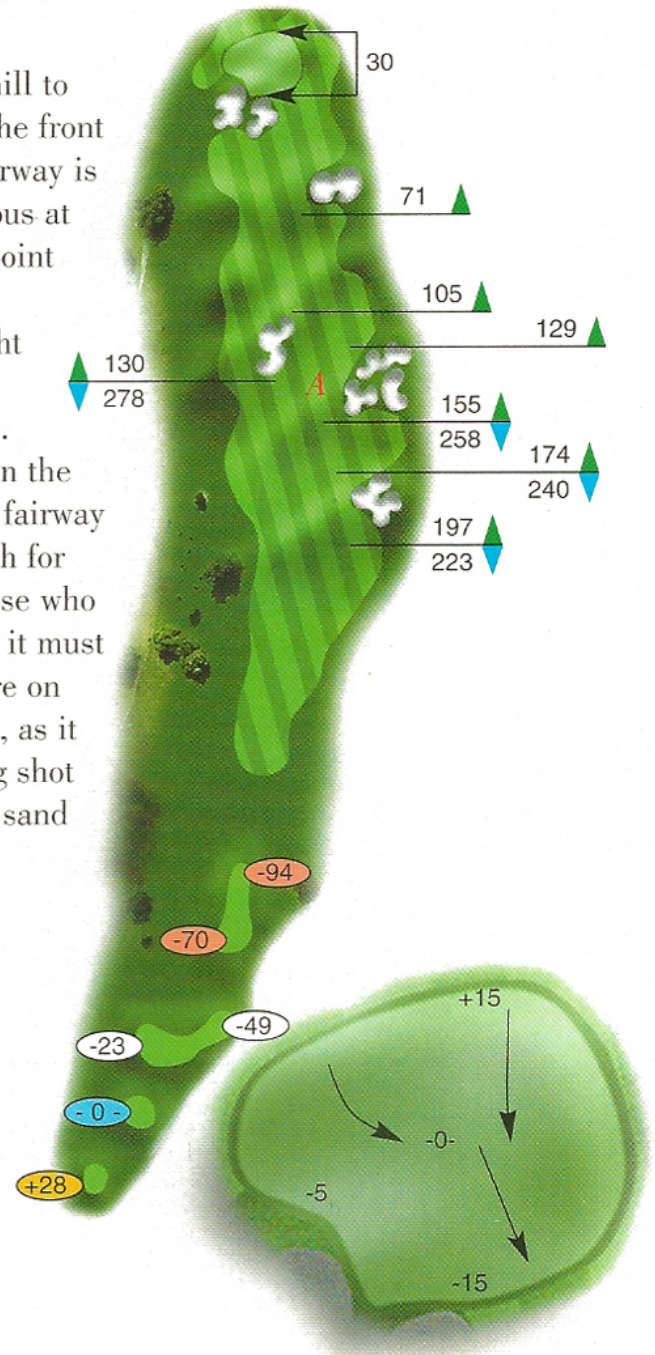

9 Par 4

It is all uphill to close out the front nine. The fairway is pretty generous at the turning point with bunkers along the right side of the major hazard. The bunker in the center of the fairway is out of reach for most, but those who cannot reach it must then take care on the approach, as it will be a long shot in with more sand to negotiate.

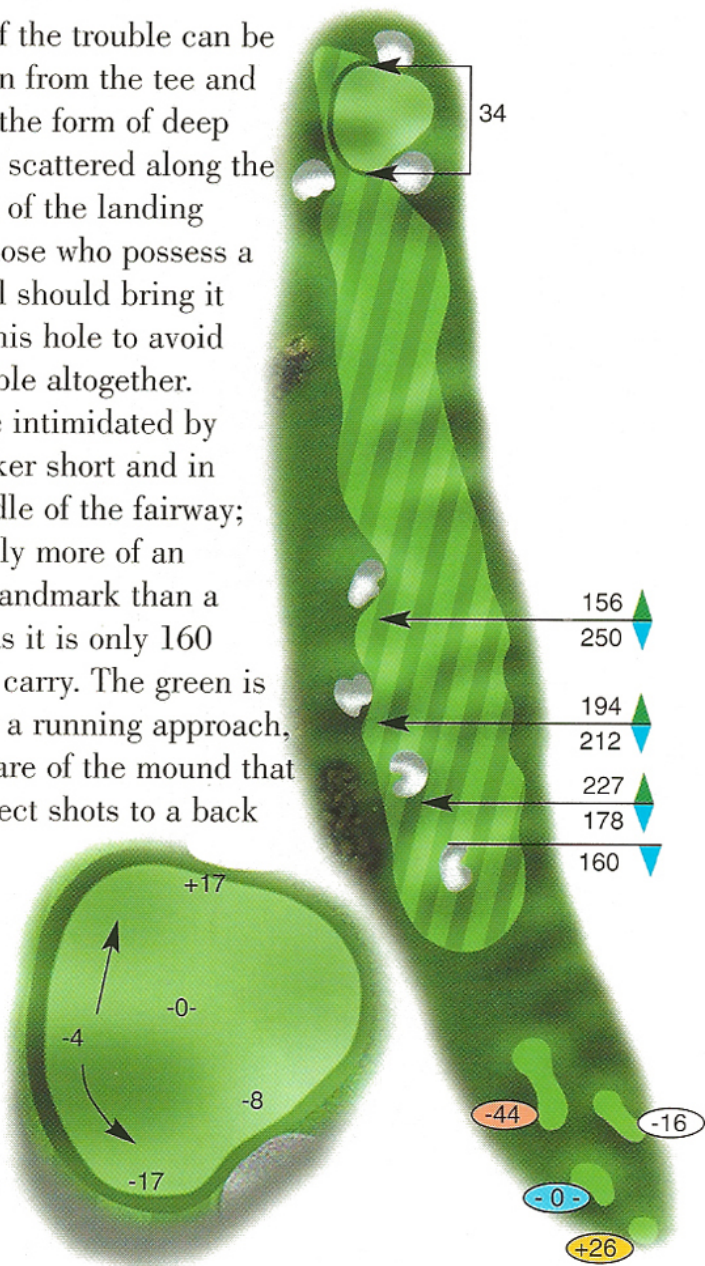

10 Par 4
Hcp 16 **432** **406** 390 **362**

All of the trouble can be seen from the tee and it takes the form of deep bunkers scattered along the left side of the landing area. Those who possess a long ball should bring it out on this hole to avoid the trouble altogether. Don't be intimidated by the bunker short and in the middle of the fairway; it is really more of an aiming landmark than a hazard as it is only 160 yards to carry. The green is open for a running approach, but beware of the mound that will deflect shots to a back left pin.

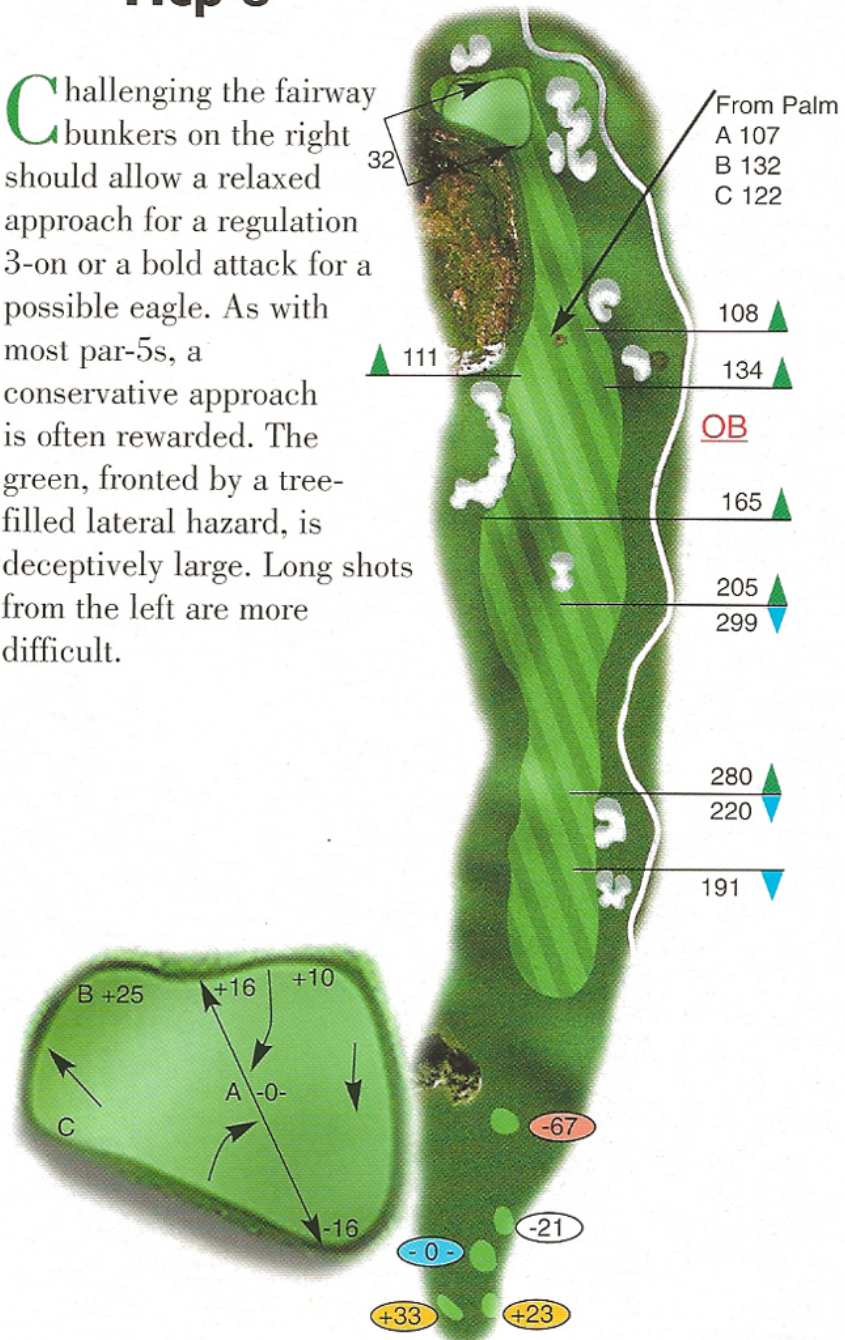

11 Par 5
Hcp 8 **539** **504** 483 **437**

Challenging the fairway bunkers on the right should allow a relaxed approach for a regulation 3-on or a bold attack for a possible eagle. As with most par-5s, a conservative approach is often rewarded. The green, fronted by a tree-filled lateral hazard, is deceptively large. Long shots from the left are more difficult.



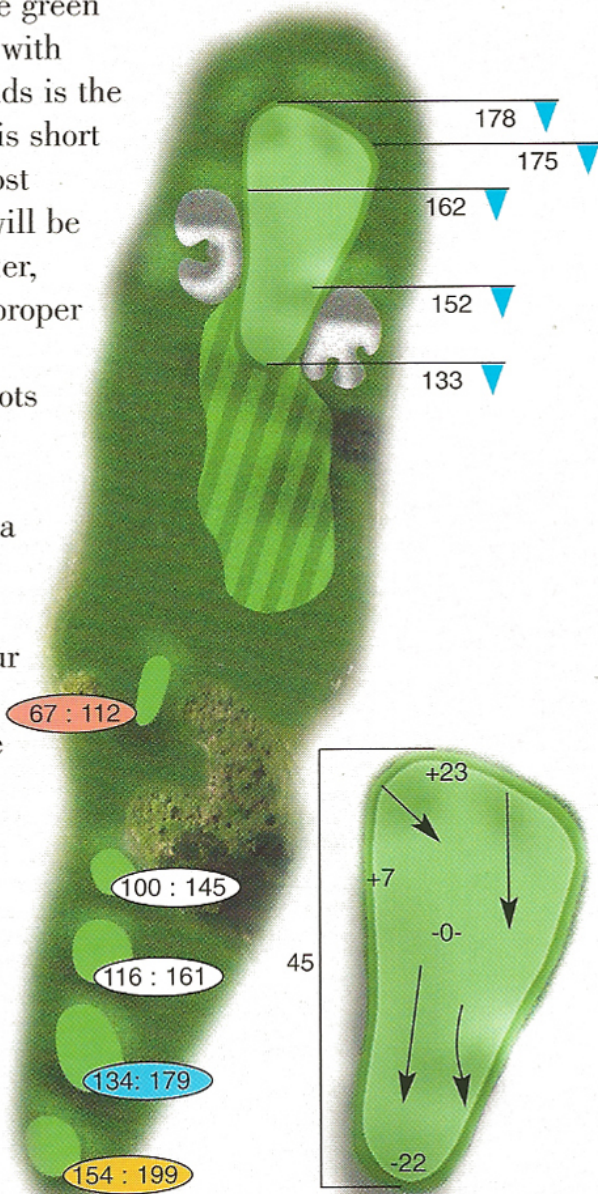

14 Par 3 | **176** | **156** | **138** | **89**
Hcp 12

Slope on the green combined with deceptive winds is the defense on this short par-3. The most difficult pin will be over the bunker, back left, so proper clubbing is important. Shots left short may end up in the collection area right front, so put it on the green. On your way to the 15th tee, take a moment to appreciate the timeless and idyllic scene in the ravine to the right.

15 Par 5 | **569** | **515** | **441** | **417**
Hcp 2

Everything about the 15th is uphill. The tee shot, the second shot and the approach keep climbing along a narrow fairway flanked by a deep ravine. For long hitters, the ideal landing area, beyond the lone fairway bunker, is severely narrowed by deep hazards on both sides. The green is quite large, but features some interesting slopes that will guard the precious par. Show your golfing intelligence and play this tough hole in a conventional manner, saving face and shots.

Hcp 4 432 394 366 316

Plan your attack on this pretty hole with precision and care. The best position for the approach is from near the fairway bunker on the left side. Too far right and you can be stymied by tall trees in the hazard. The green has a distinct ridge, so make sure you carry enough club if the pin is in the back, but watch out for trouble behind as well.

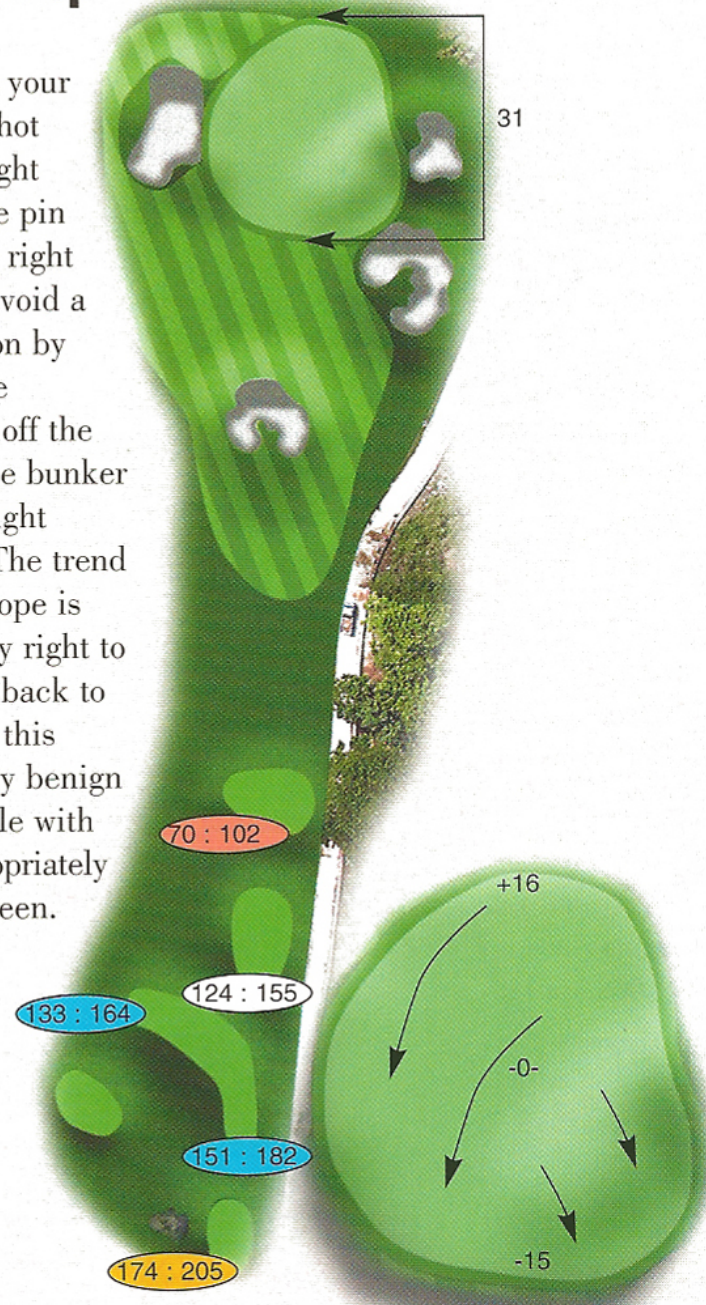

Shape your tee shot left to right when the pin is in the right rear to avoid a deflection by the ridge running off the top of the bunker on the right center. The trend of the slope is generally right to left and back to front on this relatively benign short hole with an appropriately small green.



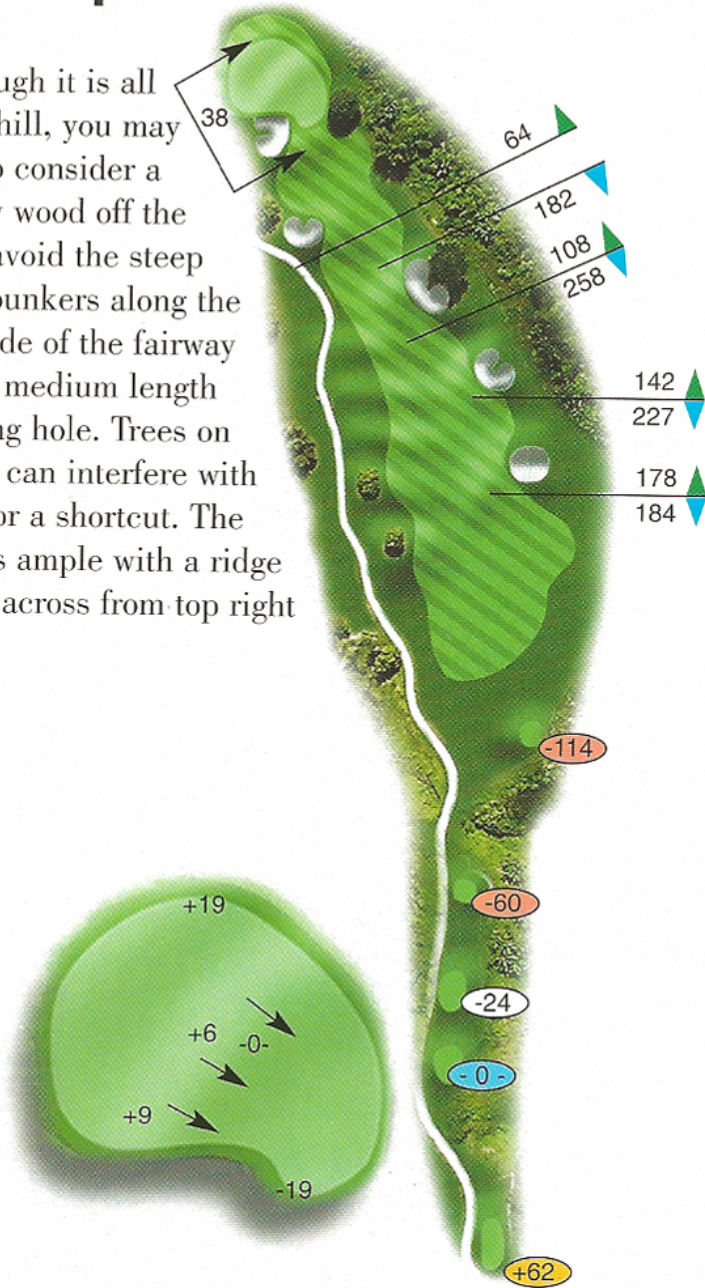

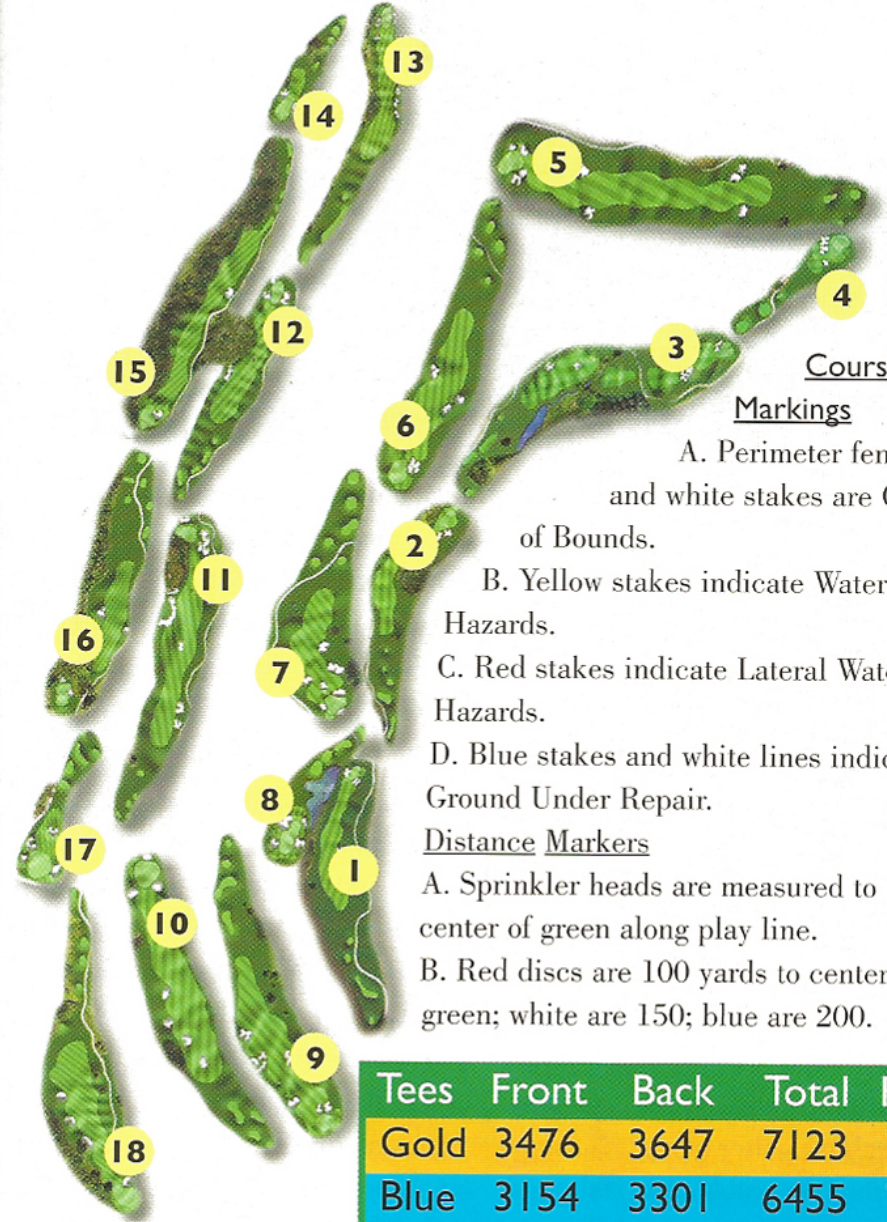

Though it is all uphill, you may want to consider a fairway wood off the tee to avoid the steep faced bunkers along the right side of the fairway on this medium length finishing hole. Trees on the left can interfere with plans for a shortcut. The green is ample with a ridge cutting across from top right to left.

C. Red stakes indicate Lateral Water Hazards.

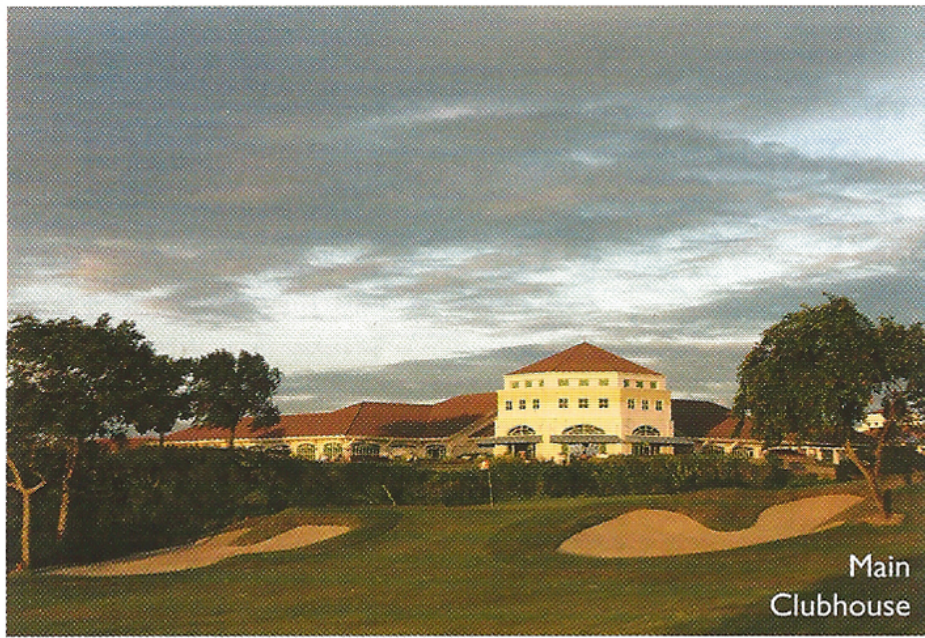
D. Blue stakes and white lines indicate Ground Under Repair.

Within sight of Makati, yet a world apart, Eagle Ridge Golf and Country Club began its life as a grand vision shared by Tomas Alcantara of Alsons Land and Exequiel Robles of Sta Lucia Realty. With construction under the guidance of Engineer Winifred Gob, work began in September, 1997 on the first two signature courses by master architect Andy Dye and world famous champion golfer Nick Faldo. Work on the second two signature courses by famous Australian golfer, Greg Norman and the venerable and talented Isao Aoki of Japan soon followed.

The Faldo Course is a great challenge that puts a premium on length off the tee and shotmaking,

the fundamentals around which Nick built his illustrious career. Faldo, with 3 British Opens and 3 Masters green jackets, is one of golf's modern masters.

The Dye Course, designed by Andy Dye of the famous golfing family, makes great use of the land with most of the holes flanked by deep ravines and many of the greens and bunkering reminiscent of the great courses of Scotland. It is generally thought to be one of the most difficult golf courses in Asia, but if you get to know her twists and turns and play from the appropriate tees, you will have an enjoyable day.

Japanese champion, Isao Aoki has put his years of experience worldwide into making the Aoki

Course all things to all golfers, from a pleasant walk in the park to a formidable sporting challenge.

At the Norman Course, famous Aussie golfer Greg Norman, created a special look and feel with undulating greens, generous fairways, rugged ravines and deeply sculptured bunkers.

In addition to 72 holes of great championship golf and a world class practice facility, it was decided to construct not one, not two, but 3 golf clubhouses and a comprehensive Family and Sports Clubhouse as well. All the clubhouses have pro shops for your every sporting need and each course has a full complement of top-notch caddies, umbrella girls and golf carts.

The Dye Clubhouse was the first to be occupied and has men's and women's locker rooms, sauna, massage, a function room, a golfers' lounge serving international cuisine and a karaoke facility. Tees number 1 and 10 are at opposite sides of the clubhouse and the golfers' lounge offers a stunning view of the par-5 9th hole.

Next on the agenda was the only Japanese-inspired clubhouse ever to be built in the Philippines. With its elegantly curved gray tile roof and pale brushed wood interior the Aoki Clubhouse is a perfect accent to the Eagle Ridge facilities. A Koi Pond and a sushi bar, lockers featuring sauna and traditional soaking pools, steam rooms and jacuzzis echo Japan.



The Main Golf Clubhouse serves as the jumping-off point for the Nick Faldo and Greg Norman courses. Sporting locker rooms with lounge, sauna, massage, a memorabilia room and a golfers lounge, the Main Clubhouse can accommodate over 300 golfers for tournaments and special events.

Adjacent to the Main clubhouse is the comprehensive Family and Sports Clubhouse, featuring function rooms, a 144-seat theater with facilities for DVD and computer projection for both entertainment and corporate presentations and an internet room. There is a wide variety of sporting venues including a large resort-style swimming pool for adults and kids, a basketball court

that can be converted into a 500 seat hall, a 14 lane bowling alley with a café, a fully equipped gym, indoor badminton, tennis and table tennis, billiards and a kiddie playroom.

A complete golf and sports community, Eagle Ridge offers 4554 beautifully situated lots covering 700 hectares, overlooking Manila Bay

All told, the combined facilities at Eagle Ridge Golf and Country Club can accommodate 800 golfers a day plus an additional 1,000 people utilizing its many function rooms and multi-purpose facilities.
